HIGHLIGHTS

This report presents findings from the 2017 National Mental Health Services Survey (N-MHSS), an annual census of all known facilities in the United States, both public and private, that provide mental health treatment services to people with mental illness.¹

Planned and directed by the Center for Behavioral Health Statistics and Quality (CBHSQ) of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the N-MHSS is designed to collect data on the location, characteristics, and utilization of organized mental health treatment services for facilities within the scope of the survey throughout the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and other jurisdictions.²

It is important to note that values in charts, narrative lists, and percentage distributions are calculated using actual raw numbers and rounded for presentation in this report; calculations using rounded values may produce different results.

- In 2017, the response rate among facilities eligible to complete the survey was 87 percent [Table 1.1].
- A total of 11,866 facilities completed the survey. After excluding the 284 facilities that provided only administrative services, data from 11,582 eligible respondent facilities were included in this report [Table 1.1].

Facility Characteristics and Services

- About 40 percent of mental health treatment facilities were outpatient facilities [Table 2.1].
- Mental health treatment facilities could offer services in more than one type of service setting (e.g., inpatient, residential, outpatient). Of all mental health treatment facilities, 76 percent offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services [Table 2.1].
- Most mental health treatment facilities were privately operated (82 percent). Of all mental health treatment facilities, 64 percent were operated by private non-profit organizations, and 18 percent were operated by private for-profit organizations [Table 2.2b].
- Over 95 percent of psychiatric hospitals, general hospitals with a separate psychiatric unit, and Veterans Administration medical centers provided psychotropic medication therapy [Table 2.3b].
- Programs or groups designated or exclusively designed for persons with serious mental illness were offered by 44 percent of mental health treatment facilities; 43 percent of all facilities offered programs or groups designated or exclusively designed for persons with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders [Table 2.6b].

In this report, entities responding to the N-MHSS are referred to as "facilities."

- Almost half of mental health treatment facilities (49 percent) reported that they employ a crisis intervention team to handle acute mental health issues [Table 2.8].
- Most mental health treatment facilities indicated that they accepted Medicaid (89 percent) or cash or self-payment (84 percent) for services [Table 2.9b].

Selected Facility Characteristics at the Regional and State Levels

- New York and California had the largest total numbers of facilities (843 and 866 facilities, respectively). There were two other states that had more than 500 facilities each: Ohio and Pennsylvania. These four states combined accounted for 24 percent of all mental health treatment facilities that responded to the survey in 2017 [Tables 3.1a-b].
- Private non-profit organizations operated 64 percent of all mental health treatment facilities. The Census region with the largest proportion of mental health treatment facilities operated by private non-profit organizations was the Northeast (75 percent). Next were the Midwest (69 percent), West (61 percent), and South (53 percent). There were 13 states/jurisdictions in which more than 80 percent of all mental health treatment facilities were operated by private non-profit organizations [Tables 3.2a-b and Figure 9].
- Private for-profit organizations operated 18 percent of all mental health treatment facilities. The Census region with the largest proportion of mental health treatment facilities operated by private for-profit organizations was the South (24 percent). Next were the West (20 percent), Midwest (15 percent), and Northeast (10 percent) [Tables 3.2a-b].
- In 10 states/jurisdictions, less than 40 percent of facilities provided 24-hour inpatient treatment services through a general hospital (Alaska, Arizona, Delaware, Georgia, Louisiana, Nevada, Puerto Rico, South Dakota, Texas, and Washington) [Table 3.3b].
- Overall, the dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs or groups most commonly offered by mental health treatment facilities were for persons with serious mental illness (44 percent), individuals with co-occurring mental and substance abuse disorders (43 percent), persons who have experienced trauma (34 percent), and children/adolescents with serious emotional disturbance and individuals with post-traumatic stress disorder (33 percent each) [Tables 3.10a-b and Figure 12].
- Overall, the proportion of mental health treatment facilities that provided treatment services in languages other than English was 65 percent, ranging from 74 percent in the West to 60 percent in the Midwest. The proportions of facilities where staff provided treatment services in Spanish were 53 percent in the West, 38 percent in the Northeast, 27 percent in the South, and 19 percent in the Midwest [Table 3.11].

CHAPTER 1 DESCRIPTION OF THE NATIONAL MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES SURVEY (N-MHSS)

This report presents findings from the 2017 National Mental Health Services Survey (N-MHSS) conducted from March 2017 through December 2017. The N-MHSS collects information from all known facilities in the United States, both public and private, that provide mental health treatment services to people with mental illness.³ The Center for Behavioral Health Statistics and Quality (CBHSQ) of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, plans and directs the N-MHSS.

The N-MHSS provides a mechanism for quantifying the dynamic character and composition of the U.S. mental health treatment delivery system. It is the only source of national- and state-level data on the mental health services delivery system reported by both publicly and privately operated specialty mental health treatment facilities. The N-MHSS is designed to collect data on the location, characteristics, and utilization of organized mental health treatment services for facilities within the scope of the survey throughout the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and other jurisdictions. The N-MHSS complements, but does not duplicate, the information collected through SAMHSA's survey of substance abuse treatment facilities, the National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services (N-SSATS).

The objective of the N-MHSS is to collect data that can be used to:

- assist SAMHSA and state and local governments in assessing the nature and extent of services
 provided in state-funded, state-operated, and private non-profit and for-profit mental health
 treatment facilities, and in forecasting mental health treatment resource requirements;
- update SAMHSA's Inventory of Behavioral Health Services (I-BHS), an inventory of all known mental health and substance abuse treatment facilities in the United States, which can be used as a frame for future surveys of these facilities;
- describe the nature and scope of mental health treatment services and conduct comparative analyses for the nation and states; and
- update the information in the mental health component of SAMHSA's online Behavioral Health Treatment Services Locator, which includes a searchable database of public and private facilities for the provision of mental health treatment. The Locator is available at https://findtreatment.samhsa.gov.

In this report, entities responding to the N-MHSS are referred to as "facilities."

Data Collection Procedures for the 2017 N-MHSS

Field period and reference date

The field period for the 2017 N-MHSS, which included mailing and data collection operations, ran from March 28, 2017, through December 13, 2017. The reference date was April 28, 2017.

Survey universe

The survey universe for the 2017 N-MHSS included 14,646 facilities across the United States and other jurisdictions. Most facilities in the 2017 N-MHSS frame were identified from the updated database produced after fielding the 2010 and 2014 N-MHSS, supplemented by the 2015 and 2016 mental health augmentation, and new facilities that states requested be added to the I-BHS.

Survey coverage

The following types of mental health treatment facilities were included in the 2017 N-MHSS:

- *Psychiatric hospitals* are facilities licensed and operated as state/public psychiatric hospitals, or as state-licensed private psychiatric hospitals that primarily provide 24-hour inpatient care to persons with mental illness. They may also provide 24-hour residential care and/or less than 24-hour care (i.e., outpatient, partial hospitalization), but these additional service settings are not requirements.
- General hospitals with a separate inpatient psychiatric unit are licensed general hospitals (public or private) that provide inpatient mental health services in separate psychiatric units. These units must have specifically allocated staff and space for the treatment of persons with mental illness. The units may be located in the hospital itself or in a separate building that is owned by the hospital.
- Veterans Administration (VA) medical centers are facilities operated by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, including general hospitals with separate psychiatric inpatient units, residential treatment programs, and/or psychiatric outpatient clinics.
- Partial hospitalization/day treatment mental health facilities provide only partial day mental health services to ambulatory clients, typically in sessions of three or more hours on a regular schedule. A psychiatrist generally assumes the medical responsibility for all clients and/or for the direction of their mental health treatment.
- Outpatient mental health facilities provide only outpatient mental health services to ambulatory clients, typically for less than three hours at a single visit. A psychiatrist generally assumes the medical responsibility for all clients and/or for the direction of their mental health treatment.
- Residential treatment centers (RTCs) for children are facilities not licensed as psychiatric hospitals that primarily provide individually planned programs of mental health treatment in a residential care setting for children under age 18. (Some RTCs for children may also treat young adults.) RTCs for children must have a clinical program that is directed by a psychiatrist, psychologist, social worker, or psychiatric nurse who has a master's or doctoral degree.

- Residential treatment centers (RTCs) for adults are facilities not licensed as psychiatric hospitals that primarily provide individually planned programs of mental health treatment in a residential care setting for adults.
- Multi-setting mental health facilities⁵ provide mental health services in two or more service settings (non-hospital residential, plus either outpatient and/or day treatment/partial hospitalization), and are not classified as a psychiatric hospital, general hospital, medical center, or residential treatment center.
- Community mental health centers (CMHCs) provide either (1) outpatient services, including specialized outpatient services for children, the elderly, individuals who are chronically mentally ill, and residents of its mental health service area who have been discharged from inpatient treatment at a mental health facility; (2) 24-hour emergency care services; (3) day treatment or other partial hospitalization services, or psychosocial rehabilitation services; or (4) screening for patients being considered for admission to state mental health facilities to determine the appropriateness of the admission. To be classified as a CMHC, a facility must meet applicable licensing or certification requirements for CMHCs in the state in which it is located.
- Other types of residential treatment facility refers to facilities not licensed as a psychiatric hospital, whose primary purpose is to provide individually planned programs of mental health treatment services in a residential care setting, and is not specifically for children or adults only.
- Other refers to another type of hospital or mental health facility not defined in the categories above.

Exclusions

The survey universe for the 2017 N-MHSS excluded: (1) Department of Defense (DoD) military treatment facilities; (2) individual private practitioners or small group practices not licensed as a mental health clinic or center; and (3) jails or prisons.

Facilities are not eligible for inclusion in the survey universe if they only provide one or more of the following services: crisis intervention services, psychosocial rehabilitation, cognitive rehabilitation, intake, referral, mental health evaluation, health promotion, psychoeducational services, transportation services, respite services, consumer-run/peer support services, housing services, or legal advocacy. Residential facilities whose primary function is not to provide specialty mental health treatment services are also not eligible for inclusion in the survey universe for the N-MHSS.

The classification of psychiatric hospital, general hospital, medical center, or residential treatment center—any of which can offer mental health services in two or more service settings—takes precedence over a multi-setting classification.

Content

The 2017 N-MHSS instrument, which appears in its print format as Appendix A, is a six-page document with 26 numbered questions. Topics include:

- facility type, operation, and primary treatment focus;
- facility treatment characteristics (e.g., settings of care; mental health treatment approaches, supportive services and practices, and dedicated or exclusively designed programs or groups offered; and crisis intervention team availability);
- facility operating characteristics (e.g., age groups accepted; services provided in non-English languages; and smoking policy); and
- facility management characteristics (e.g., computerized functionality; licensure, certification, and accreditation; and sources of payment and funding).

Data collection

Three data collection modes were employed: a secure web-based questionnaire, a paper questionnaire sent by mail, and a computer-assisted telephone interview (CATI). Approximately three weeks before the survey reference date (April 28, 2017), SAMHSA mailed letters to the attention of the facility directors of all eligible facilities to alert them to expect the survey and to request their participation in the N-MHSS (Appendix B). The letter also served to update records with new address information received from the U.S. Postal Service. A data collection packet (including SAMHSA cover letter, state-specific letter of support, information on completing the survey on the web, and fact sheet of frequently asked questions) was mailed to each facility on April 28, 2017. The web-based survey also became available at the same time. At this point, each facility had the option of completing the questionnaire via the secure survey website or asking for a paper questionnaire to complete and return via postal mail. In August 2017, another, similar packet was sent to non-responding facilities, this time including a copy of the questionnaire, a definitions packet, and a postage-paid return envelope.

During the data collection phase, contract personnel were available by telephone to answer facilities' questions concerning the survey. Web-based support for facilities completing the questionnaire on the web was also available. Multiple reminder letters were sent to non-respondents over the course of the data collection period via fax, mail, and e-mail. To increase the survey response rate, state mental health agency representatives were contacted during the data collection period to inform them of their state's progress and to request additional help in encouraging responses. Blaise®-to-web follow-up (assisted telephone interviews) of non-respondents began in August 2017 and ended in early December 2017.

Eligibility and unit response rate

Table 1.1 presents a summary of eligibility and response rate information. Of the 14,646 mental health treatment facilities in the survey, 7 percent were found to be ineligible for the survey because they did not provide mental health treatment services; had a primary treatment focus of substance abuse services or general health care; provided treatment for incarcerated persons only (i.e., in jails or prisons); were an individual or small group mental health practice not licensed or certified as a mental health center or clinic; or were closed.

Facility Reporting and Selection for the 2017 N-MHSS Report

Of the 13,618 facilities eligible for the survey, 87 percent completed the survey, including 284 facilities that did not provide direct mental health treatment services. (These 284 facilities, which provided administrative services only, were excluded from the report, but have been included in SAMHSA's online Behavioral Health Treatment Services Locator.) After excluding the 284 facilities that provided only administrative services, data from 11,582 eligible respondent facilities were included in the 2017 N-MHSS report. Of the respondents that were eligible for the report, 90 percent completed the survey on the web, 3 percent through the mail, and 8 percent on the telephone.

Quality Assurance

All completed mail questionnaires underwent a manual review for consistency and missing data. Calls to facilities clarified questionable responses and obtained missing data. After data entry, automated quality assurance reviews were conducted. The reviews incorporated the rules used in manual editing plus consistency checks not readily identified by manual review. The web-based questionnaire was programmed to be self-editing; that is, respondents were prompted to complete missing responses and to confirm or correct inconsistent responses on critical items. The CATI questionnaire was similarly programmed.

Response Rates

The final unit response rate among facilities eligible for the survey was 87 percent. Extensive follow-up during data collection and careful editing maximized item response; the item response rates averaged approximately 98 percent across all 144 separate items (see Appendix C).

Response rates for Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands declined in 2017, compared with the previous year; both territories were affected by Hurricanes Maria and Irma in September 2017.

Of Puerto Rico's 100 eligible facilities in 2017, 61 percent responded, down from 99 percent (87 of 88 eligible facilities) in 2016. Of the U.S. Virgin Islands' eight eligible facilities, all of which responded in 2016, only half responded in 2017.

Data Considerations and Limitations

As with any data collection effort, certain procedural considerations and data limitations must be taken into account when interpreting data from the 2017 N-MHSS. Some general issues are listed below. Considerations and limitations of specific data items are discussed where the data are presented.

- The N-MHSS is a voluntary survey, and while every effort is made to obtain responses from all known mental health treatment facilities within the scope of the survey, some facilities did not respond. There was no adjustment for the 13 percent facility non-response.
- When possible, we used cold-deck imputation to fill in item non-response. This is a technique that uses historical information from previous surveys to supplement the current data. In the N-MHSS, missing values were imputed using survey data collected in 2016.
- Multiple responses were allowed for certain questionnaire items (e.g., services provided in non-English languages and type of payment or insurance accepted for mental health treatment services). Tabulations of data for these items include the total number of facilities reporting each response category.

Organization of the Report

The balance of this report is organized into the following chapters:

- Chapter 2 describes key characteristics of facilities and the programs and services they provided in 2017.
- Chapter 3 presents Census region- and state-level detail for some of the tables presented in Chapter 2.
- Appendix A contains the 2017 N-MHSS mail survey questionnaire.
- Appendix B contains details of the data collection procedures.
- Appendix C contains information on item response rates.
- Appendix D contains the list of contributors.

It should be noted that the 2017 N-MHSS findings as discussed in Chapters 2 and 3 of this report, as well as all Chapter 2 and Chapter 3 figures, have been rounded to whole numbers to assist the reader. Please note that percentage distributions in all Chapter 2 and Chapter 3 tables and figures may not add to 100 percent due to rounding. In addition, to protect the confidentiality of data reported at the state level, the numbers in some Chapter 2 and 3 table cells have been suppressed.

CHAPTER 2 FACILITY CHARACTERISTICS AND SERVICES

This chapter describes key features of mental health treatment facilities included in the 2017 N-MHSS. See Chapter 1 for definitions of the types of mental health treatment facilities included in the N-MHSS.

Facility Type and Facility Operation




Figure 1. Facility type: 2017

Table 2.1 and Figure 1. Facilities were classified according to one of the following facility type categories: psychiatric hospitals, general hospitals, residential treatment centers (RTCs) for children, RTCs for adults, community mental health centers, outpatient mental health facilities (including outpatient or day treatment or partial hospitalization mental health facilities), other types of residential treatment facilities, multi-setting mental health facilities, Veterans Administration (VA) medical centers, or other.

Figure 1 presents the percent distribution of the 11,582 facilities by type of facility.




Figure 2. Facility operation: 2017

Tables 2.2a-b and Figure 2. Facilities were asked about the type of entity responsible for their operation. Of all 11,582 facilities, 64 percent were operated by private non-profit organizations. Next were private for-profit organizations (18 percent) and regional/district authorities (7 percent).

Service Settings Offered

Table 2.1 and Figure 3. The four service settings (levels of care) in which facilities offered mental health treatment services were 24-hour hospital inpatient services (inpatient), 24-hour residential services (residential), less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization services (day treatment/partial hospitalization), and less than 24-hour outpatient services (outpatient). A facility could offer care in more than one service setting.

Figure 3. Of all 11,582 mental health treatment facilities, 76 percent offered less than 24-hour outpatient services, 17 percent offered 24-hour residential services, 16 percent offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization, and 16 percent offered 24-hour inpatient services.

- Among outpatient mental health facilities, more than 99 percent offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services, 6 percent offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization services, less than 1 percent offered 24-hour residential services, and less than 1 percent offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services.
- Among psychiatric hospitals, about 99 percent offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services. Greater proportions of private psychiatric hospitals (51 percent) than public psychiatric hospitals (6 percent) offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization services. Greater proportions of private psychiatric hospitals (43 percent) than public psychiatric hospitals (19 percent) also offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services.
- Among multi-setting facilities, 92 percent offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services, 53 percent offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization, 48 percent offered 24-hour residential services, and 4 percent offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services.
- All VA medical centers offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services, while 23 percent offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services.
- Among community mental health centers, 99 percent offered less than 24-hour outpatient mental health services, 12 percent offered less than 24-hour day treatment or partial hospitalization, 1 percent offered 24-hour hospital inpatient services, and 1 percent offered 24-hour residential services.




Figure 3. Service settings: 2017

Treatment Approaches

Tables 2.3a-b. Facilities indicated whether or not they offered specific types of treatment approaches.

- Among facility respondents, the most commonly offered treatment approaches were individual
 psychotherapy, cognitive/behavioral therapy, group therapy, and psychotropic medication
 therapy.
- Individual psychotherapy was offered by at least three fifths of each facility type, ranging from 99 percent of Veterans Administration medical centers to 60 percent of residential treatment centers for adults. Cognitive behavioral therapy was offered by more than half of each facility type, ranging from 94 percent of multi-setting mental health facilities and Veterans Administration medical centers, each, to 58 percent of residential treatment centers for adults. Group therapy was offered by 98 percent of private psychiatric hospitals and 65 percent of residential treatment centers for adults.
- Over 97 percent of psychiatric hospitals, general hospitals, and VA medical centers provided psychotropic medication therapy. By comparison, psychotropic medication therapy was provided by a smaller proportion of partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities (74 percent) and outpatient mental health facilities (72 percent).
- The least common mental health treatment approach provided by facilities was electroconvulsive therapy, offered at 5 percent of all facilities. Electroconvulsive therapy was most commonly offered in general hospitals with a separate psychiatric unit (31 percent) and private psychiatric hospitals (17 percent).

Services and Practices

Tables 2.4a-b. Facilities were asked if they provided specific supportive services and practices. A facility could provide supportive services and practices for more than one type of service or practice.

- The most common types of supportive services/practices were case management (67 percent), family psycho-education (63 percent), and suicide prevention services (57 percent).
- The percentage of mental health treatment facilities offering case management ranged from 48 percent of public psychiatric hospital facilities to 86 percent of community mental health centers.
- The percentage of mental health treatment facilities offering suicide prevention services ranged from 39 percent of RTCs for adults to 91 percent of VA medical centers.
- The percentage of mental health treatment facilities offering family psychoeducation ranged from 34 percent of RTCs for adults to 73 percent of multi-setting mental health facilities.
- The least common types of supportive services/practices offered were legal advocacy and therapeutic foster care (5 percent each). Public psychiatric hospitals had the largest proportion of facilities that offered legal advocacy (27 percent). RTCs for children (14 percent), other types of residential treatment facilities (14 percent), and multi-setting mental health facilities (16 percent) had the largest proportions of facilities that offered therapeutic foster care.

Age Groups




Figure 4. Age groups accepted for treatment: 2017

Table 2.5 and Figure 4. Facilities were asked if they accepted the following age groups for treatment: children (aged 12 or younger), adolescents (aged 13 to 17), young adults (aged 18 to 25), adults (aged 26 to 64), and seniors (aged 65 or older). Facilities could accept more than one age group for treatment.

Figure 4 presents the proportions of facilities that accepted various age groups for treatment.

- The most common age categories of clients accepted were young adults (87 percent), adults (83 percent), and seniors (80 percent).
- Fewer than half (43 percent) of all facilities accepted persons of all ages for treatment.
- Community mental health centers (71 percent) and outpatient mental health facilities (57 percent) had the largest proportions of all facilities that accepted persons of all ages.

Dedicated or Exclusively Designed Treatment Programs or Groups for Specific Client Types




Figure 5. Facilities offering programs for persons with co-occurring mental and substance use disorders, by facility type: 2017

Tables 2.6a-b and Figure 5. Facilities were asked if they offered dedicated or exclusively designed programs or groups for specific client types.

- Among all types of mental health treatment facilities, close to half offered dedicated or exclusively
 designed treatment programs or groups for persons with serious mental illness (44 percent) and
 persons with co-occurring mental and substance use disorders (43 percent).
- About 35 percent of outpatient mental health facilities provided dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs or groups for persons who have experienced trauma and 39 percent of outpatient mental health facilities provided dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs or groups for persons with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders.
- A greater proportion of public psychiatric hospitals than general hospitals provided dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs or groups for forensic clients (53 vs. 8 percent).
- With the exception of RTCs for children, at least 36 percent of all facility types offered dedicated or exclusively designed programs or groups for persons with serious mental illness.

- Dedicated or exclusively designed programs or groups for persons with co-occurring mental and substance use disorders were most commonly offered by private psychiatric hospitals (63 percent), VA medical centers (54 percent), and multi-setting mental health facilities (54 percent).
- Facility types serving a specific population had the highest proportion of facilities that offered programs exclusively designed for such populations. For example, 79 percent of RTCs for children operated programs designed for children/adolescents with serious emotional disturbance, compared with other facility types, among which this specific program was present between 0 and 58 percent of the time.
- VA medical centers had the highest proportion of facilities that offered programs designed for veterans, persons with post-traumatic stress disorder, and persons with traumatic brain injury (98, 75, and 30 percent, respectively).

Treatment Services Provided in Languages Other Than English and for the Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing

Table 2.7. Facilities were asked if treatment services were provided in a language other than English, if staff provided the services in other languages, and in what other languages staff provided services. Facilities were also asked if they offered treatment services for the deaf and hard-of-hearing.

- Of all facilities, 65 percent provided treatment services in languages other than English. In 33 percent of all facilities, staff provided services in Spanish.
- Greater proportions of psychiatric hospitals (79 percent), general hospitals (77 percent), and community mental health centers (75 percent) provided services in languages other than English. RTCs for children had the lowest proportion of services provided in languages other than English (33 percent).
- The proportions of facilities with staff that provided treatment services in Spanish ranged from 15 percent among VA administration medical facilities to 43 percent among public psychiatric hospitals.
- Less than 1 percent of all facilities provided services in an American Indian or Alaskan Native language.
- More than half of all facilities (51 percent) offered treatment services for the deaf and hard-of-hearing. About four fifths of general hospitals and psychiatric hospitals offered treatment services for the deaf and hard-of-hearing (77 and 78 percent, respectively).

Crisis Intervention Teams

Table 2.8. Facilities were asked whether or not they employ a crisis intervention team.

- Almost half of facilities indicated that they employ a crisis intervention team to handle acute mental health issues (49 percent).
- The proportions of facilities that had a crisis intervention team within the facility and/or offsite ranged from 37 percent of outpatient mental health facilities to 70 percent of community mental health centers.


• A greater proportion of private psychiatric hospitals (56 percent) than public psychiatric hospitals (40 percent) employed a crisis intervention team within the facility and/or offsite.

Types of Payment or Insurance Accepted

Tables 2.9a-b and Figure 6. Facilities were asked to indicate the types of client payments, insurance, or funding that were accepted for the treatment services they provided.

- Large proportions of community mental health centers accepted Medicaid (98 percent), cash or self-payment (92 percent), and private health insurance (88 percent).
- Greater proportions of RTCs for adults than of RTCs for children accepted cash or self-payment (72 vs. 60 percent) and Medicare (50 vs. 10 percent), while greater proportions of RTCs for children than of RTCs for adults accepted private health insurance (67 vs. 49 percent) and state-financed health insurance (47 vs. 39 percent).

- A greater proportion of private psychiatric hospitals than of public psychiatric hospitals accepted cash or self-payment (93 vs. 85 percent), federal military insurance (77 vs. 47 percent), and state-financed health insurance plans (65 vs. 55 percent).
- Medicaid was accepted by at least 81 percent of all facility types, with two exceptions: Only 16 percent of VA medical centers and only three quarters of other types of residential treatment facilities accepted Medicaid.

Smoking Policy

Table 2.10. Facilities were asked about their smoking policy.

- Half of all mental health treatment facilities (50 percent) reported that smoking was not permitted anywhere outside or within any building, and 43 percent reported that smoking was permitted in designated outdoor areas.
- Compared with all other types of facilities, RTCs for children, general hospitals, and public psychiatric hospitals most commonly prohibited smoking altogether (93, 92, and 89 percent, respectively).
- More than three quarters of VA medical centers (81 percent) and RTCs for adults (77 percent) permitted smoking only in designated outdoor areas. More than half of multi-setting mental health facilities (53 percent) permitted smoking only in designated outdoor areas. Among community mental health centers, nearly half (49 percent) permitted smoking only in designated outdoor areas.

Facility Licensing, Certification, or Accreditation

Tables 2.11a-b. Facilities were asked if they have any licensing, certification, or accreditation. A facility could be licensed, certified, or accredited by one or more agencies or organizations.

- Of all mental health treatment facilities, 72 percent were licensed, certified, or accredited by state mental health authorities, 49 percent by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), 48 percent by state departments of health, and 34 percent by the Joint Commission.
- Over 80 percent of VA medical centers, psychiatric hospitals, and general hospitals were licensed, certified, or accredited by the Joint Commission.

CHAPTER 3 SELECTED FACILITY CHARACTERISTICS AT THE REGIONAL AND STATE LEVELS

This chapter presents the data for the U.S. Census regions, states, and jurisdictions that were discussed at the national level in Chapter 2. Throughout this chapter, states/jurisdictions are defined as the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the combined jurisdictions of American Samoa, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. Note that facilities operated by federal agencies (i.e., Department of Veterans Affairs, Indian Health Service) are included in the states in which the facilities are located, although these facilities may provide services to clients from other states.

The 11,582 mental health treatment facilities that responded to the 2017 N-MHSS represent a rate of approximately 4 facilities per 100,000 population, based on the states and jurisdictions included in this report.⁶ New York and California had the largest total numbers of facilities (843 and 866 facilities, respectively). There were two other states that had more than 500 facilities each: Ohio and Pennsylvania [Tables 3.1a-b]. These four states combined accounted for 24 percent of all mental health treatment facilities that responded to the survey in 2017.




Figure 7. U.S. Census regions and divisions

Figure 7 presents the U.S. Census regions for the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Throughout this chapter and in the Chapter 3 tables, data for all U.S. territories included in the 2017 N-MHSS, except Puerto Rico, have been aggregated and are discussed as a single category, "other jurisdictions."

Based on 2017 mid-year U.S. Census estimates, the population for the United States is 325,719,178, and the population for Puerto Rico is 3,337,177, totaling 329,056,355 people (https://census.gov/data/tables/2017/demo/popest/nation-total.html). Based on mid-year estimates for 2016, the World Bank estimated that the population for American Samoa as 55,599, Guam as 162,896 people, and the U.S. Virgin Islands as 102,951—a total of 321,446 people (http://data.worldbank.org/indicator/). When these two sources are combined, the total population for the United States and these jurisdictions is 329,377,801 individuals. This figure was used for subsequent rate calculations in this chapter.

Facility Type




Figure 8. States in which 40 percent or more of all mental health treatment facilities were outpatient mental health facilities: 2017

Table 3.1a-b and Figure 8. Of the 11,582 mental health treatment facilities, outpatient mental health facilities and community mental health centers accounted for the greatest proportions of facilities (40 and 22 percent, respectively).

- In two states, fewer than 10 percent of all mental health treatment facilities were outpatient mental health facilities: New Hampshire and South Carolina.
- In three states, 60 percent or more of all mental health treatment facilities were outpatient mental health facilities: District of Columbia, Idaho, and Wisconsin.
- Four states each had 10 or more public psychiatric hospitals: California, New York, Texas, and Virginia.
- Four states each had more than 30 private psychiatric hospitals: California, Florida, Louisiana, and Texas.

- Four states each had more than 50 general hospitals with separate psychiatric units: California, Illinois, New York, and Pennsylvania.
- Five states each had 30 or more RTCs for children: California, Massachusetts, New York, North Carolina, and Texas.
- Six states each had 40 or more RTCs for adults: Arizona, California, Florida, Illinois, New York, and Oregon.
- Three states each had at least 40 partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities: New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania.
- There were three states that each had 25 or more multi-setting mental health treatment facilities: California, Ohio, and Pennsylvania.




Figure 9. States in which 80 percent or more of all mental health treatment facilities were operated by private non-profit organizations: 2017

Facility Operation

Tables 3.2a-b and Figure 9 present data on facility operation.

- There were 13 states/jurisdictions in which more than 80 percent of all mental health treatment facilities were operated by private non-profit organizations.
- Private non-profit organizations operated 64 percent of all mental health treatment facilities. The Census region with the largest proportion of mental health treatment facilities operated by private non-profit organizations was the Northeast (75 percent), followed by the Midwest (69 percent), West (61 percent), and South (53 percent).
- The proportion of facilities operated by private non-profit organizations was highest in New Hampshire (92 percent), followed by Colorado and South Dakota (89 percent and 88 percent, respectively). The proportion of facilities operated by private non-profit organizations was lowest in Idaho (9 percent), South Carolina (10 percent), and Nevada (15 percent).
- There were five states that had more than 300 facilities operated by private non-profit organizations: California, Florida, New York, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. By contrast, there were seven states/jurisdictions (Delaware, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, North Dakota, South Carolina, and other jurisdictions) in which 20 or fewer of the facilities were operated by private non-profit organizations.

- Private for-profit organizations operated 18 percent of all mental health treatment facilities. The Census region with the largest proportion of mental health treatment facilities operated by private for-profit organizations was the South (24 percent), followed by the West, Midwest, and Northeast (20, 15, and 10 percent, respectively).
- The states/jurisdictions with the highest proportions of facilities operated by private for-profit organizations were Idaho (75 percent), other jurisdictions (67 percent), Puerto Rico (51 percent), North Carolina (51 percent), Louisiana (47 percent), Utah (41 percent), and Wisconsin (36 percent).
- There were seven states in which private for-profit organizations operated 100 or more facilities (Arizona, California, Florida, Idaho, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin), and these seven states combined accounted for 40 percent of all mental health treatment facilities operated by private for-profit organizations.
- Overall, regional/district authorities operated 7 percent of all mental health treatment facilities. Regional/district authorities operated 11 percent of facilities in the West, 8 percent of facilities in the South, 7 percent of facilities in the Midwest, and 4 percent of facilities in the Northeast.
- Regional/district authorities operated more than 20 percent of facilities in Alabama, California, and Virginia.
- State mental health authorities (SMHAs) operated 4 percent of all mental health treatment facilities. The proportion was highest in the South (6 percent), followed by the Northeast (5 percent), Midwest (2 percent), and West (1 percent).
- The state in which SMHAs operated the highest proportion of facilities was South Carolina (55 percent). SMHAs operated more than 15 percent of facilities in three additional states/jurisdictions: North Dakota, Oklahoma, and other jurisdictions.
- Two states each had 60 or more SMHA-operated mental health treatment facilities: New York and South Carolina.

Service Settings Offered

Tables 3.3a-3.6b present the type of service settings offered by type of facility, region, and state/territory. Overall findings by service setting include:

- Of the 1,885 facilities that provided treatment services in 24-hour inpatient settings, general hospitals with separate psychiatric units and psychiatric hospitals, combined, accounted for 92 percent. General hospitals accounted for 57 percent of facilities that provided treatment services in 24-hour inpatient settings; psychiatric hospitals accounted for 35 percent [Table 3.3b].
- By Census region, the proportion of general hospitals that provided treatment services in 24-hour inpatient settings ranged from 46 percent in the West to 66 percent in the Northeast [Table 3.3b].
- In 10 states/jurisdictions, less than 40 percent of facilities provided 24-hour inpatient treatment services through a general hospital (Alaska, Arizona, Delaware, Georgia, Louisiana, Nevada, Puerto Rico, South Dakota, Texas, and Washington) [Table 3.3b].

- Mental health treatment services in a 24-hour residential setting were provided by 2,004 facilities, of which a combined 82 percent were RTCs for adults (43 percent), RTCs for children (30 percent), and multi-setting facilities (9 percent) [Table 3.4b].
- The proportion of RTCs for children that provided treatment services in 24-hour residential settings ranged from 27 percent in the West to 35 percent in the South [Table 3.4b].
- While the majority of facilities that offered 24-hour residential treatment services were RTCs for children and RTCs for adults, states/jurisdictions varied widely in the distribution of facilities across service settings [Table 3.4b].
- Less than 24-hour partial hospitalization/day treatment was provided by 1,802 facilities, of which a combined 78 percent were partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities (21 percent), community mental health centers (17 percent), outpatient mental health facilities (14 percent), general hospitals (14 percent), and multi-setting facilities (11 percent) [Table 3.5b].
- The proportion of partial hospitalization/day treatment facilities that provided treatment services in less than 24-hour partial hospitalization/day treatment settings ranged from 14 percent in the Midwest to 36 percent in the Northeast [Table 3.5b].
- The proportion of community mental health centers that provided treatment services in less than 24-hour partial hospitalization/day treatment settings ranged from 10 percent in the Northeast to 25 percent in the South [Table 3.5b].
- Most of the 8,853 facilities that provided mental health treatment services in less than 24-hour outpatient settings were outpatient mental health facilities (52 percent); less than 1 percent were public psychiatric hospitals [Table 3.6b].
- The proportion of outpatient mental health facilities that provided treatment services in less than 24-hour outpatient treatment settings ranged from 43 percent in the South to 64 percent in the Northeast [Table 3.6b].
- The proportion of facilities that provided less than 24-hour outpatient treatment in outpatient mental health facilities ranged from a low of 9 percent in New Hampshire to a high of 83 percent in Wisconsin [Table 3.6b].

Treatment Approaches

Tables 3.7a-b present data on treatment approaches offered by mental health treatment facilities by region and state/jurisdiction.

- Individual psychotherapy was offered by 91 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 89 percent of facilities in the South to 93 percent of facilities in the Midwest.
- Couples/family therapy was offered by 71 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 68 percent of facilities in the South to 74 percent in the Midwest.
- Group therapy was offered by 85 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, with facilities ranging from 83 percent in the Midwest to 88 percent in the West.

- Cognitive behavioral therapy was offered by 88 percent of all facilities, ranging from 87 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 90 percent of facilities in each the Midwest and the West.
- Dialectical behavioral therapy was offered by more than 75 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in four states/jurisdictions (Colorado, North Dakota, Utah, and Wyoming).
- Integrated dual disorders treatment was offered by 68 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in seven states/jurisdictions (Georgia, Kentucky, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, Vermont, Wyoming, and other jurisdictions).
- Trauma therapy was offered by 85 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in eight states/jurisdictions (Alaska, Colorado, Delaware, Kentucky, North Dakota, Nevada, South Dakota, and Wyoming).
- Activity therapy was offered by at least 55 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in eight states/jurisdictions (Alaska, Alabama, Mississippi, New Mexico, Oregon, Vermont, Wyoming, and other jurisdictions).
- Electroconvulsive therapy was offered by 7 percent or more of mental health treatment facilities offered in 11 states/jurisdictions (Iowa, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Missouri, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Carolina, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, Texas, and Virginia).
- Telemedicine therapy was offered by 55 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in six states (Arkansas, Delaware, New Mexico, North Dakota, Texas, and Wyoming).
- Psychotropic medication was offered by 90 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in 11 states (Alabama, Arkansas, Connecticut, Georgia, Hawaii, Louisiana, New York, North Dakota, Rhode Island, South Carolina, and Texas).

Services and Practices




Figure 10. Mental health treatment facilities offering psychiatric emergency walk-in services, by region: 2017

Tables 3.8a-b present data on the services and practice approaches offered by mental health treatment facilities; Figure 10 displays the proportion of mental health treatment facilities that offered psychiatric emergency walk-in services, by region.

- Assertive community treatment was offered by 14 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 11 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 17 percent in the West.
- Intensive case management was offered by 24 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 15 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 34 percent in the West.
- Case management was offered by 67 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 51 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 79 percent in the West.
- Court-ordered outpatient treatment was offered by 45 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 40 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 50 percent in the Midwest.
- Chronic disease/illness management was offered by at least 29 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in six states/jurisdictions (Colorado, Hawaii, Missouri, Puerto Rico, Rhode Island, and South Dakota).

- Illness management and recovery were offered by 45 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in five states/jurisdictions (Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Rhode Island, and Texas).
- Integrated primary care services were offered by more than 40 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in four states/jurisdictions (District of Columbia, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, and Puerto Rico).
- Diet and exercise counseling was offered by 50 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in five states/jurisdictions (Hawaii, New Hampshire, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, and other jurisdictions).
- Family psychoeducation was offered by 63 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 58 percent of facilities in the Midwest to 68 percent in the West.
- Education services were offered by 30 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 28 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 31 percent of facilities in each the Midwest, the West, and the South.

- Housing services were offered by 21 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 18 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 28 percent in the West.
- Supported housing was offered by 15 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 12 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 18 percent in the West.
- Psychosocial rehab services were offered by at least 60 percent of mental health treatment facilities in five states/jurisdictions (Alaska, California, Idaho, Oklahoma, and South Carolina).
- Vocational rehab services were offered by 25 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in nine states/jurisdictions (Arizona, Colorado, New Hampshire, New York, North Dakota, Rhode Island, Vermont, Wyoming, and other jurisdictions).
- Supported employment was offered by 35 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in five states/jurisdictions (New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Texas, Vermont, and Wyoming).
- Therapeutic foster care was offered by 10 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in six states/jurisdictions (Alaska, Kentucky, Maine, Montana, South Dakota, and Tennessee).
- Legal advocacy was offered by 5 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 4 percent of facilities in each the South and Midwest to 7 percent in the Northeast.
- Psychiatric emergency walk-in services were offered by 31 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 26 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 39 percent in the South.
- Suicide prevention services were offered by 57 percent of all mental health treatment facilities, ranging from 53 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 60 percent in the South.
- Consumer-run (peer support) services were offered by more than 35 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in eight states/jurisdictions (Colorado, Idaho, Minnesota, Oregon, South Carolina, Texas, Vermont, and Washington).
- Screening for tobacco use was offered by at least 65 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in seven states/jurisdictions (Indiana, Mississippi, New Hampshire, New York, North Dakota, Oklahoma, and Rhode Island).
- Smoking/tobacco cessation counseling was offered by 60 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in four states/jurisdictions (Hawaii, New Hampshire, New York, and Oklahoma).
- Nicotine replacement therapy was offered by 40 percent or more of the mental health treatment facilities in six states/jurisdictions (Hawaii, Indiana, New Hampshire, New York, Oklahoma, and Texas).
- Non-nicotine smoking/tobacco cessation medications were offered by 23 percent of all mental
 health treatment facilities, ranging from 17 percent of facilities in the West to 30 percent in the
 Northeast.


Table 3.9 and Figure 11 present data on facilities accepting children (aged 12 years and younger), adolescents (aged 13 to 17 years), young adults (aged 18 to 25 years), adults (aged 26 to 64 years), and seniors (aged 65 years and older) for treatment.

- Regardless of region, higher proportions of facilities accepted young adults or adults than children
 or adolescents. The proportion of facilities accepting young adults ranged from 85 percent in the
 South to 90 percent in the Midwest; the proportion accepting adults ranged from 82 percent in
 the Northeast to 88 percent in the Midwest. The proportion of facilities accepting children ranged
 from 53 percent in the Northeast to 65 percent in the Midwest, and the proportion of facilities
 accepting adolescents ranged from 59 percent in the Northeast to 70 percent in the Midwest.
- Overall, 43 percent of mental health treatment facilities accepted clients of all ages. The proportion of facilities accepting all ages was highest in the Midwest (54 percent), followed by the South (44 percent), Northeast (37 percent), and West (36 percent).
- In six states, more than 60 percent of mental health treatment facilities accepted clients of all ages (Idaho, Iowa, South Dakota, West Virginia, Wisconsin, and Wyoming). In four states/jurisdictions, 27 percent or fewer mental health treatment facilities accepted clients of all ages (California, Hawaii, Rhode Island, and other jurisdictions).

Dedicated or Exclusively Designed Treatment Programs or Groups for Specific Client Types

Tables 3.10a-b and Figure 12 present facilities offering dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs or groups for specific client types.

- Overall, the dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs or groups most commonly offered by mental health treatment facilities were for persons with serious mental illness (44 percent), individuals with co-occurring mental and substance abuse disorders (43 percent), persons who have experienced trauma (34 percent), and children/adolescents with serious emotional disturbance and individuals with post-traumatic stress disorder (33 percent each).
- In all regions, more mental health treatment facilities offered dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs for persons with serious mental illness (ranging from 40 percent in the Midwest to 48 percent in the South) than for children/adolescents with serious emotional disturbance (ranging from 30 percent of facilities in the Northeast to 36 percent of facilities in the South).

- More than 58 percent of the mental health treatment facilities in four states offered dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs for persons with serious mental illness (Hawaii, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, and South Carolina). The state with the highest proportion of facilities offering dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs for children with serious emotional disturbance was Alaska (58 percent), while more than half of facilities in six other states (Arkansas, Kansas, Kentucky, North Dakota, Nevada, and South Dakota) offered these programs.
- The region with the highest proportion of facilities offering dedicated or exclusively designed treatment programs to individuals with co-occurring mental and substance abuse disorders was the South (47 percent). Next were the West (44 percent), Northeast (41 percent), and Midwest (38 percent).

Treatment Services Provided in Languages Other Than English and for the Deaf and Hard-of-Hearing




Figure 13. Mental health treatment facilities offering treatment services in sign language for the deaf and hard-of-hearing, by region: 2017

Table 3.11 presents data on facilities providing treatment services in a language other than English and on facilities offering treatment services in sign language for the deaf and hard-of-hearing; Figure 13 presents data on facilities offering treatment services in sign language for the deaf and hard-of-hearing.

- Overall, the proportion of mental health treatment facilities that provided treatment services in languages other than English was 65 percent, ranging from 74 percent in the West to 60 percent in the Midwest. The proportions of facilities where staff provided treatment services in Spanish were 53 percent in the West, 38 percent in the Northeast, 27 percent in the South, and 19 percent in the Midwest.
- Puerto Rico led all states/jurisdictions in the proportion of facilities with staff providing treatment services in Spanish (83 percent), followed by California (77 percent), other jurisdictions (67 percent), District of Columbia and New Mexico (62 percent each), Arizona and Texas (59 percent each), and Florida (54 percent).
- Overall, more than half of all mental health treatment facilities (51 percent) offered treatment services in sign language for the deaf and hard-of-hearing. The proportion of facilities offering treatment services in sign language for the deaf and hard-of-hearing was highest in the South (56 percent), followed by the Midwest (55 percent), West (50 percent), and the Northeast (43 percent).
- In four states, 70 percent or more of facilities offered treatment services in sign language for the deaf and hard-of-hearing (Alabama, Kentucky, New Hampshire, and South Carolina). Treatment services in sign language for the deaf and hard-of-hearing were offered by 40 percent or fewer of facilities in 10 states/jurisdictions (Alaska, Connecticut, Idaho, Maryland, Montana, New Jersey, North Carolina, Oregon, Wyoming, and other jurisdictions).

Crisis Intervention Teams

Table 3.12 presents data on whether or not facilities employ a crisis intervention team by region and state/jurisdiction.

- Facilities that had a crisis intervention team within the facility and/or offsite ranged from 39 percent in Northeast to 52 percent in South.
- In all states/jurisdictions, at least 30 percent of facilities indicated that they employ a crisis intervention team to handle acute mental health issues.

Types of Payment or Insurance Accepted




Figure 14. Mental health treatment facilities accepting Medicare, by region: 2017

Tables 3.13a-b and Figure 14 present data on the specific types of payment or insurance accepted by facilities.

- Overall, Medicaid was accepted by 89 percent of mental health treatment facilities.
- Medicare payments were accepted by 69 percent of all mental health treatment facilities; the highest proportion was in the Midwest (74 percent), followed by the Northeast (70 percent), the South (69 percent), and the West (60 percent).
- Cash or self-payment was accepted by 84 percent of all mental health treatment facilities. The Midwest had the highest proportion of facilities that accepted cash or self-payment (90 percent). Cash or self-payment was accepted by 85 percent of facilities in the South, 81 percent of facilities in the Northeast, and 75 percent of facilities in the West.

- Private health insurance was accepted by 80 percent of all mental health treatment facilities.
 The Midwest had the highest proportion of facilities that accepted private health insurance
 (89 percent), followed by the South (81 percent), the Northeast (79 percent), and the West (69 percent).
- Medicaid was accepted by 95 percent or more of mental health treatment facilities in eight states (Arkansas, Iowa, Maryland, Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, West Virginia, and Wyoming). It was accepted by 80 percent or fewer of facilities in five states/jurisdictions (California, Florida, Puerto Rico, Utah, and other jurisdictions).
- Medicare was accepted by 80 percent or more of mental health treatment facilities in seven states (Hawaii, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, North Dakota, South Carolina, and Texas). It was accepted by 55 percent or fewer of facilities in seven states/jurisdictions (Alaska, Delaware, Idaho, North Carolina, Utah, Washington, and other jurisdictions).
- Private health insurance was accepted by more than 95 percent of mental health treatment facilities in five states (Arkansas, Kansas, Minnesota, North Dakota, and Wyoming).

Facility Licensing, Certification, or Accreditation

Tables 3.14a-b. Facilities were asked if they have any licensing, certification, or accreditation. A facility could be licensed, certified, or accredited by one or more agencies or organizations.

- The percentage of mental health treatment facilities that were licensed, certified, or accredited by state mental health authorities ranged from 68 percent in South to 80 percent in Northeast.
- More than 40 percent of mental health treatment facilities were licensed, certified, or accredited by the state department of health in every Census region.
- At least 35 percent of mental health treatment facilities were licensed, certified, or accredited by the Joint Commission in three of the four Census regions. In the West, 24 percent of mental health treatment facilities were licensed, certified, or accredited by the Joint Commission.

APPENDIX B DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURES

Survey Frame

The survey frame for the 2017 N-MHSS originally consisted of 14,646 known facilities. Most facilities in the 2017 N-MHSS frame were identified from the updated database produced after fielding the 2010 and 2014 N-MHSS, the 2015 and 2016 mental health augmentation, and new facilities that states requested be added to the I-BHS.

Data Collection

Data collection took place between March 28, 2017, and December 17, 2017. During that period, facilities were contacted through mail, e-mail, fax, and telephone to remind them to complete the survey. Of the total 14,646 facilities included in the survey frame, 1,028 (7 percent) were closed or ineligible. Ineligible facilities included those that did not provide mental health treatment, were a satellite site⁷ focused primarily on substance abuse treatment or general health care, provided treatment only for incarcerated persons in jail or prison, or were an individual or small group mental health practice not licensed or certified as a mental health clinic or center.

A satellite site is a mental health treatment facility without permanent staff of its own. Staff from another facility visit the satellite site (usually on a regular schedule) to provide treatment.
