15 Years Went by Quickly Director's Corner

On January 15, 2003, the Smoking Cessation Leadership Center at UCSF officially began, thanks to a five-year grant from The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, and later supplemented by support from the then American Legacy Foundation, now Truth Initiative.

When I arrived at UCSF that day, I had no idea of the journey ahead. All I had was an office and the opportunity to hire staff and to develop mechanisms that would help organizations do a better job supporting quit attempts by smokers. What was known as the large gap between what clinicians should do and what they actually did. SCLC's focus over the last 15 years has been how to narrow the gap among clinicians and within other relevant organizations. What evolved over the years was our strategic approach and the partners we engaged. I also did not foresee the longevity of our Center, nor the multiple other sources of support we were fortunate to secure. Looking back, here are some of the highlights of those past 15 years.
